AN ORDINANCE

ADJUSTING ELECTRIC RATES CHARGED TO CONSUMERS OF THE CITY OF HUBBARD, OHIO, ELECTRIC UTILITY EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2023.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Hubbard, Ohio deems it immediately necessary to modify the rates charged for electric due to the increased costs of purchasing said electric and maintaining the City of Hubbard, Ohio, electric system; and

WHEREAS, City Council finds that the rates or charges as hereinafter set forth are fair and equitable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Hubbard, Trumbull County, Ohio:

SECTION 1: Commencing January 1, 2023 and until amended thereafter, the following electrical rate structure, schedules, and/or regulations are hereby enacted as follows:

RESIDENTIAL SERVICE

AVAILABILITY

This rate shall only be available for installations where each family unit is served through an individual meter in single or multiple unit dwellings. The following rate shall apply to both non-load management (i.e. non-demand) and load-management (i.e. demand) residential customers as defined by the City utility:

SERVICE

Alternating current, single-phase, 60 Hz, nominal voltages of 120 volt 2 wire, 120/140 volt 3 wire or 120/208 volt 3 wire.

GENERAL COMMERCIAL SERVICE

AVAILABILITY

This rate shall only be available for all commercial customers of the city.

SERVICE

Alternating current, 60 Hz, at nominal voltages of 120/240 or 120/208 or 277 single phase, or 120/208 or 240 or 277/480 three phase, as may be available from suitable facilities of adequate capacity adjacent to the premises to be served. Other voltages may be obtained from available distribution facilities provided the customer owns, operates and maintains all necessary transforming, controlling and regulating and protective equipment, in which case service will be metered at the City supply voltage.

BILLING DEMAND IN kW

The billing demand shall be the highest measured kW demand during the month.

GENERAL INDUSTRIAL SERVICE

AVAILABILITY

Available for general Light and Power Service for individual installations served that the system's standard distribution voltages provided the customer owns, operates and maintains all necessary transforming, controlling, regulating, and protective equipment. The billing load shall not be less than 50 kilovolt amperes.

SERVICE

Alternating current, 60 Hz, three phase, at primary or transmission voltages as available form suitable facilities of adequate capacity adjacent to the premises to be served.

The customer will be responsible for all transforming, controlling, regulating, and protective equipment and its operation and maintenance.

BILLING DEMAND IN kVA

The billing kVA demand shall be the greatest of the following:

1. The measured kVA demand for the month adjusted where the service is primary metered.
2. 60% of the highest monthly kVA demand recorded during the past eleven month service period.
3. 50 kVA.

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SECTION 2: All electric services shall be subjected to the terms of payments as follows:

- a. Bills are due and payable upon receipt.
- b. Customers shall have the first ten (10) days of the month to pay the gross amount of the electric portion of their bill without penalty. The period of the billing date through the tenth day of the month shall be known as the *Ex-Penalty period*.
- c. If the tenth day of the month is a legal holiday, Saturday, or Sunday, the *ex-penalty period* shall be extended to the next regular business day immediately following the holiday or weekend day. (i.e. November 10, 2022, is a Saturday, as a result, the *ex-penalty period* will not conclude until: 1) the end of the billing office shift on Monday, November 12, 2022; and/or 2) payments placed in the City Hall Drop Box will be granted the *ex-penalty amount* until the drop box is emptied on the next regular business morning following the end of the *ex-penalty period*; and/or 3) remittance made by mail will receive the *ex-penalty* provided that the envelope postmark is on or before the final date of the *ex-penalty period*— in this example, envelope postmarks would have to be on or before November 12<sup>th</sup> in order to receive the *ex-penalty amount due*).
- d. Customers who do not pay within the *ex-penalty period*, shall have the period of the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) through the twenty-fifth (25<sup>th</sup>) of the current billing month to pay their utility bill in full in order to avoid delinquency status.
- e. Following the *ex-penalty period*, electric only portions of the bill shall be subjected to a 1.50% penalty. The penalty shall compound each subsequent billing cycle until the utility account is current.
- f. All other provision of the Utility Terms of Payment ordinance shall continue to apply to delinquent electric bills.

SECTION 3: Seasonal or Temporary Discontinuance of Service shall be subjected to the following terms and conditions: Where service has been discontinued at the customer's request any minimum charges as provided shall not be applicable during such discontinuance, but in lieu thereof a charge of \$100.00 will be made when service is re-established.

SECTION 4: Security lighting shall be provided according to the following rate and fee schedule:

EXISTING INSTALLATION (metal halide or mercury vapor fixture):

MONTHLY CHARGE:  
175 W Lamp \$ 8.00  
250 W Lamp \$11.00

NEW INSTALLATION (70-90w LED fixture): \$275.00  
MONTHLY CHARGE: \$ 5.00

NEW INSTALLATION (Barn-style fixture): \$325.00  
MONTHLY CHARGE: \$ 7.00

SECTION 5: Power Cost Adjustment (PCA): The PCA will apply to all Utility Rate Schedules except non-metered and special contract rates.

**Calculation:**

The PCA will be calculated using the most recent six months actual power cost and applied to each customer's following monthly billed energy (kWh) or a two-month lag from when the cost occurred to when billed.

The PCA Adjustment shall be calculated according to the following formula:

$$PCA = [(P/S) * (I + L)] - B$$

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Where:

**P** = Wholesale power supplier cost - Utility cost of power during previous six-month period calculated using the most recent six months actual power cost plus periodic true up of accumulated positive or negative balance of recovered cost of power resulting from the application of the PCA. If an unusual occurrence happens resulting in abnormally high cost the Management/Governing body will determine whether that cost should be recovered over a longer period.

**S** = Number of kilowatt-hours sold - Sales are estimated by dividing kilowatt-hours purchased by (1 + L), during the same time period as factor "P".

**L** = System annual average losses (6.6%)

**B** = This amount reflects the average cost of power per kilowatt-hour sold and recovered through base retail rates (\$0.09538)

**SECTION 6:** All prior Ordinances or parts thereof in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 7:** All formal actions of the City Council of Hubbard, Ohio relating to the adoption of this Ordinance, and all deliberations of the City Council of Hubbard, Ohio and any of its committees leading to such action, were in meeting open to the public as required by law.
